

# Argyle

Difficulty: Advanced

## SIZE

One size fits most golf clubs.

## MATERIALS

- [P] 1 skein Malabrigo Worsted Weight Yarn (216 yards per 3.5 oz); color: 184 Shocking Pink
- [G] 1 ball Malabrigo Worsted Weight Yarn (216 yards per 3.5 oz); color: 4 Sapphire Green
- [W] 1 ball Malabrigo Worsted Weight Yarn (216 yards per 3.5 oz); color: 602 Pale Khaki
- US 5 / 3.75 mm straight needles
- US 7 / 4.5 mm straight needles
- Scissors
- Darning needle
- Pompom maker

## GAUGE

20 Sts/ 24 rows = 4 inches in St st on larger needles

## PATTERN NOTES

This pattern incorporates the technique of Fair Isle knitting; you will be using three colors per row. Remember to keep the yarn not in use stranded *loosely* on the wrong side of your work.

Argyle Pattern:

- Row 1 (Right Side) - K: \*P1, W7, G1, W7; rep from \*.  
Row 2 - P: \* P1, W5, G1, W1, G1, W5, P2; rep from \*.  
Row 3 - K: \* P3, W3, G1, W3, G1, W3, P2; rep from \*.  
Row 4 - P: \* P3, W1, G1, W5, G1, W1, P4; rep from \*.  
Row 5 - K: \* P3, G2, W7, G2, P2; rep from \*.  
Row 6 - P: \* P1, G1, P3, W5, P3, G1, P2; rep from \*.  
Row 7 - K: \* P1, G1, P5, W3, P5, G1; rep from \*.  
Row 8 - P: \* P7, W1, P7, G1; rep from \*.



Row 9 - Repeat Row 7.  
Row 10 - Repeat Row 6.  
Row 11 - Repeat Row 5.  
Row 12 - Repeat Row 4.  
Row 13: - Repeat Row 3.  
Row 14: Repeat Row 2.

Repeat these 14 rows for pattern.

## PATTERN

With G and smaller needles, cast on 48 sts. Work in K1, P1 rib for 6 inches. Changing to larger needles, begin Argyle pattern. Work 2 repeats of pattern; begin Decrease Rows as noted below.

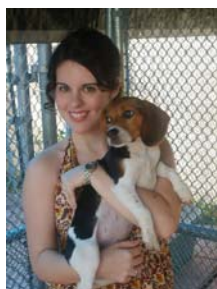
Decrease Rows:

Row 1: \* K2, K2tog; rep from \*.  
Row 2: Purl.  
Row 3: \*K1, K2tog; rep from \*.  
Row 4: Purl.  
Row 5: \*K2tog; rep from \*.  
Row 6: Purl.

## FINISHING

Cut yarn, leaving 18 inch tail. Thread tail through remaining sts and pull tightly to close. Sew side seam. With P, make large pompom and attach to top of cover. Weave in all ends.
