

Golf Like an Egyptian

Difficulty: Easy

Create beautiful mosaic covers for your clubs by using an easy slip-stitch pattern which uses only one color per row! A great introduction to color work.

SIZE

One size fits most golf clubs.

MATERIALS

- Malabrigo Worsted Weight Yarn (216 yards per 3.5 oz); 1 skein each color:
 1. [P] 39 Molly
 2. [W] 602 Pale Khaki
 3. [G] 11 Apple Green
- US 5 / 3.75 mm straight needles
- US 7 / 4.5 mm straight needles
- Scissors
- Darning needle
- Pompom maker

GAUGE

20 sts/ 24 rows = 4 inches in St st on larger needles

PATTERN NOTES

Egyptian Staircase Pattern:

Row 1: With P, k1, sl 1 wyib, *k3, sl 1 wyib; rep from *, end k1.

Row 2: With P, k1, sl 1 wyif, *p3, sl 1 wyif; rep from *, end p1.

Row 3: With W, k4, *sl 1 wyib, k3, sl 1 wyib, k1, sl 1 wyib, k3, sl 1 wyib, k5; rep from *, end last repeat k4.

Row 4: With W, k1, p3, *sl 1 wyif, p3, sl 1 wyif, p1, sl 1 wyif, p3, sl 1 wyif, p6; rep from *, end last repeat p4.

Row 5: With P, k3, *sl 1 wyib, k3; rep from *.

Row 6: With P, p3, *sl 1 wyif, p3; rep from *.

Row 7: With W, k2, *sl 1 wyib, k3, sl 1 wyib, k5, sl 1 wyib, k3, sl 1 wyib, k1; rep from *, end k1.

Row 8: With W, p2, *sl 1 wyif, p3, sl 1 wyif, p5, sl 1 wyif, p3, sl 1 wyif, p1; rep from *, end p1.

Repeat these 8 rows for pattern.



PATTERN

With P and smaller needles, cast on 51 sts. Work in K1, P1 rib for 6 inches. Changing to larger needles, purl one row with W. Begin Egyptian Staircase Pattern. Work 6 repeats of pattern; begin Decrease Rows as noted below.

Decrease Rows:

Row 1: K3, k2tog to last st, k1.

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: K2, k2tog to last st, k1.

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5: K1, k2tog to last st, k1.

Row 6: Purl.

Row 7: K2tog across.

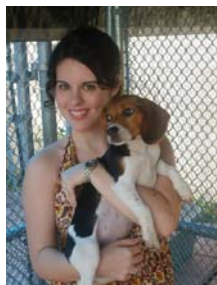
Row 8: Purl.

Row 9: K2tog to last st, k1.

FINISHING

Cut yarn, leaving 18 inch tail. Thread tail through remaining sts and pull tightly to close. Sew side seam. With G, make large pompom and attach to top of cover. Weave in all ends.
